Break the Bias

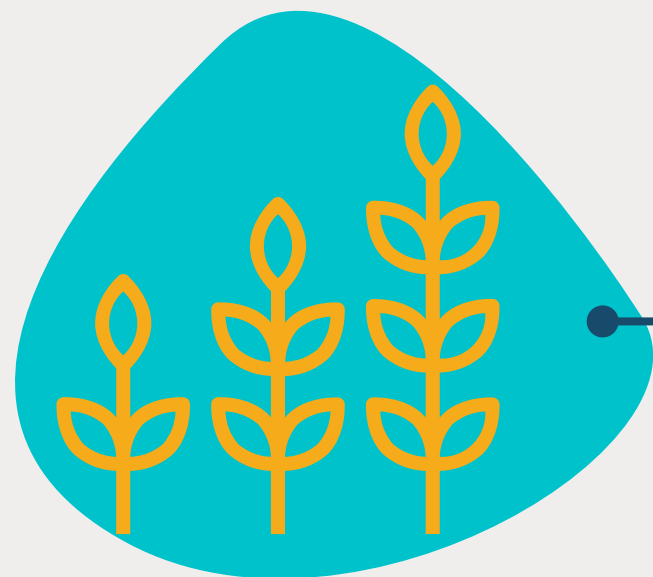
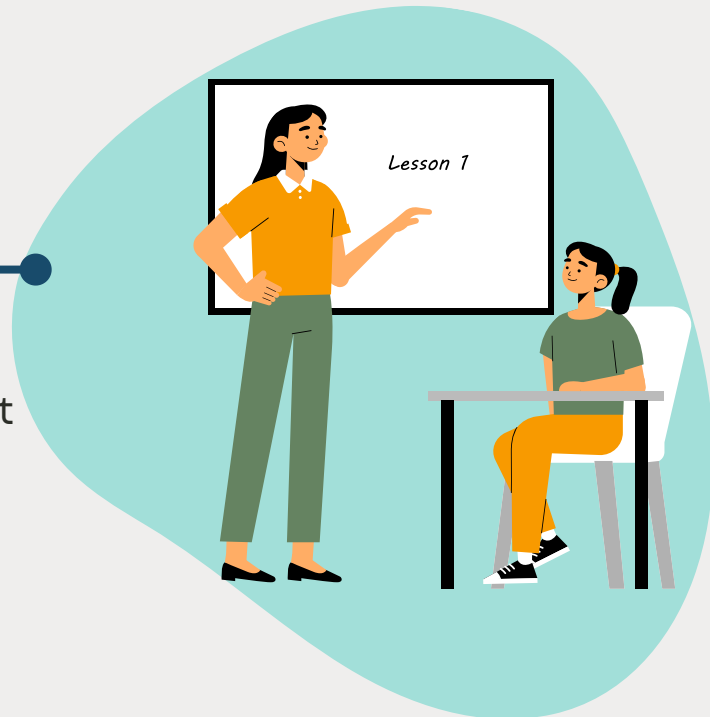


Language matters
